







Manual - How to use the myMUB mobile app

The myMUB mobile application is a tool meant to facilitate the functioning of English-speaking students, PhD students and scientists at the Medical University of Bialystok (MUB). Due to the fact that the mobile app includes tips and information about Białystok and the Podlaskie region, the app could be also useful for Polish students of the MUB as well as students from other universities located in the city.

The application contains **12** modules:

- 1. **University** containing information about the university, clinical hospitals, research at the MUB, the Branicki Palace, as well as the tab regarding the admission process for English-language studies.
- 2. **Campus*** a module created on the basis of web mapping, with marked university buildings, faculties, hospitals, dorms and service places (restaurants, clubs, copy centres, hotels) located within the MUB campus. Each place has a showcase containing basic data such as opening hours, address, phone number and e-mail address. The module also includes an option to navigate to the target place. Thanks to the search engine and points filtering, it is easy to find selected place.
- 3. **Schedule** a day plan management tool integrated with the smartphone calendar.
- 4. **News** an information module that publishes the latest information from the life of the Medical University of Bialystok and important announcements. The news mainly come from the official website of the MUB.
- 5. **Guide** a comprehensive guide for new students or foreign guests, including contact details of Dean's Offices and MUB units that support foreign students, information on dormitories, student organisations, transport (bus timetable and taxi services), legalisation of stay, security, healthcare in Poland (including lists of hospitals, healthcare centres and pharmacies), transport, as well as a Polish-English glossary with the most commonly used words and phrases.
- 6. **Welcome Centre** containing a list of matters that can be dealt with at the Welcome Centre, as well as the possibility of quick contact with employees managing the contact point for foreign students.
- 7. **Education** a kind of compendium of knowledge about English-language studies. Here, students have the opportunity to check syllabuses, class schedules, study regulations, and easily contact the English Division Dean's Office.
- 8. **Emergency Numbers** a module for making emergency calls (112 emergency number, 997 police, 998 fire brigade, 999 ambulance).
- 9. **International Cooperation** a module which describes, among others, MUB's international cooperation with other centres from abroad, contact persons as well as a procedure for applying for trips abroad in a nutshell.













- 10. **Bialystok**** a module containing a brief description of the city and interesting places/monuments to visit, list of offices (including public offices, post offices and police stations), sport and culture facilities, as well as information about Podlaskie voivodeship. An important part of the module is the map presenting above mentioned places and points, integrated with web mapping service, with the same functionalities to map indicated in the module Campus.
- 11. **Exchange Rate** a solution that allows to easily convert the exchange rate from PLN to five foreign currencies (USD, GBP, EUR, NOK and SEK) or vice versa. It is worth to note that exchange rates are automatically updated, on the daily basis, from the NBP (Polish central bank).
- 12. **About the app** a summary module including a description of the mobile app, and information about funding source.

















• Module Emergency numbers















• Module Exchange Rate


















Additional information:

- * It is worth adding that the opening hours of certain University buildings (relates only to category: University) are approximated (not official). In some buildings there are several MUB departments located, i.e. Collegium Primum or the opening hours depend on the class schedules i.e. Department of Integrated Medical Care. It is not possible to specify exact working hours in such cases, therefore the app shows working hours from 00:00 till 00:00. The working hours sometimes relates to the administration i.e. Department of Oncology (07:30-15:30).
- ** Applies only to the category: Sightseeing (Module: Bialystok). It is worth adding that the opening hours of some places are approximated. The working hours of certain buildings are specified as 'Closed', i.e. The Becker's Palace (reason: closed for visitors) or the opening hours depends on the first and the last mass i.e. Archcathedral Basilica.
